ABOUT THE PHD MASTERCLASS

EXPLORING POST-HUMAN TERRITORY

20 December 2018 at Aarhus School of Architecture

This course gives an introduction to post-humanism and discusses it in relation to contemporary architectural design practices. The course will provide a critical discussion of key terms and design concepts from post-humanism. Focus will be on the new hybrid ecologies, in which the borders between that which has been naturally formed, and that which has been designed, are rendered blurry or even become dissolved. The course addresses its relevance for the architectural field, specifically on account of the massive impact architectural design has had on the hybrid condition; and the impact it will have in future urbanization processes.

The course is aimed at PhD students in the later stages of their research projects.

During the course the PhDs individual research projects will be discussed in relation to post-humanism, with the aim of giving a deeper theoretical contextualization of research.

The course format includes lecture by instructor, presentations from participants and group discussions.
