Important visa information

Please note that you may have to apply for a visa in order to study at the Aarhus School of Architecture. In general citizens from a country which is member of the EU Union (plus Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Switzerland) do not need a visa, whereas all others do.

The visa procedure is handled through the Danish Immigration Service (SIRI), and at their web site, you will find the up-dated information about the visa process, requirements and handling time.

Once you have been admitted, we will start up the digital procedure by preparing an electronic visa form for you. You will be contacted via the mail address you provided by the time of application by SIRI, and provided with information allowing you to enter your personal visa form, which you then fill in. A visa application fee is mandatory (pls. see the SIRI web for fees)

If you are required to pay tuition, this has to be successfully transferred to our account BEFORE we can issue a visa form – we can NOT be made responsible for any delays, due to a late transfer of tuition. The minimum transferred tuition has to be one semesters' tuition.

In the recent years, there have been problems with an increased number of visa applicants causing the processing time to be prolonged. It is therefore our best advice that you familiarize yourself with the requirements, fees and process as early as possible, and preferably before your application to the Aarhus School of Architecture is finalized.

Please note that if you are applying for admission to the full two-years Master of Arts in Architecture Program, the application for visa cannot be completed until you have provided evidence for a completed BA Program from your home institution.

As the visa application process is a matter between the applicant and the Immigration Service, we have but very little influence on the processing time and no influence on the final decision.
